

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I. INTRODUCTION

A. Background

Spectrum Associates Market Research (Spectrum Associates) conducted a research project for the New York State Bar Association (NYSBA) to determine how NYSBA could be of most assistance to law firms across the state. The study included focus groups with practice management decision-makers to explore their ideas and suggestions, and a quantitative survey with 180 practice management decision-makers representing small, medium and large law firms across the State of New York to obtain statistically projectable data on their needs and preferences. Included in the survey was a question that asked respondents for their reactions to 18 possible activities that NYSBA could undertake to assist New York State law firms. Of the 18 options included in the survey, survey respondents expressed the strongest interest in NYSBA "collecting and providing data on the economics of law practice."

In response to this request, Spectrum Associates was retained by the NYSBA to conduct an Economics of Law Practice Survey. The goal of the study was to systematically gather data to assist New York State law firms in understanding how their firm's economic practices compare to other law firms in their region and across the state.

B. Research Objectives

Data were gathered to determine law firms':

- ♦ Areas of concentration (e.g., areas of law generating the most income and most billable hours).
- ♦ Billing practices (e.g., billing rates for partners, attorneys, and paralegals/legal assistants; changes in billing rates; allocation of chargeable rates; billable hours policies; practices for charging clients for expenses incurred; and billing, payment and collections practices).
- ◆ Attorneys' workweek (e.g., total hours per week, and hours spent on specific activities per week).
- ◆ Staffing patterns (e.g., level of support staff, and willingness to use part-time and temporary staff).
- Partner compensation, and attorney and support staff salaries.
- Perceptions of the local legal business climate (e.g., appropriateness of the number of attorneys in the local community, and firm's financial health).
- Handling of other business-management related issues (e.g., size of office space, record keeping practices, professional liability coverage, and marketing activities).

C. Methodology

As a preliminary step in the research process, NYSBA obtained a list of 21,471 law firms operating in the State of New York and provided the list to Spectrum Associates. Figure 1 displays the break out of these law firms by region (i.e., New York City, Westchester County, Long Island, Albany County, Buffalo, Rochester, Syracuse, and Other 1), and size of law firm (i.e., solo, 2-9, and 10+).

As displayed in Figure 1, of the 21,471 law firms in the State of New York:

- ♦ Over four-fifths (83.5%) were solo practitioners, 14.7% have 2 − 9 attorneys, and only 1.8% had 10+ attorneys.
- ♦ Almost one-half of the law firms were located in New York City (48.7%), and another one-fourth (25.0%) was downstate in either Long Island (17.8%) or Westchester County (7.2%).

Using the list of law firms provided, Spectrum Associates calculated the number of completed surveys desired to achieve statistically projectable data for each of the eight geographic regions and determined how many surveys should be conducted within each law firm size category to obtain: (a) a proportionate mix across size of firm for each region; and (b) a sufficient number of law firms with 10+ attorneys to have statistically projectable findings for these larger firms (aggregate).

Efforts taken to gather the desired surveys included the following:

★ The NYSBA mailed out solicitations to managing partners and solo practitioners for all 21,471 law firms across the state. The mailing included a cover letter describing the study and requesting participation, and a fax response for interested firms to inform NYSBA of their willingness to participate.

- ♦ NYSBA followed up mail solicitation with 10 weeks of teler ne calls to law firms not returning the fax response. These calls included: veruying the name of the partner with access to the law firm's economic information, encouraging the desired individual to participate, and faxing out the fax response form.
- ♦ NYSBA mailed out a second round of solicitation letters to all firms that did not respond to the initial request.
- ◆ Based on low interest expressed by solo practitioners in specific regions (i.e., Buffalo, Rochester and Syracuse), NYSBA made follow-up telephone calls to increase the number of these firms in this study.
- ◆ Based on all of these efforts, partners at 1,425 law firms said they would be willing to participate in this study. All of these firms were mailed a cover letter thanking them for participating, a questionnaire booklet, and a postage paid return envelope addressed to Spectrum Associates. In addition, in an effort to increase the number of survey respondents, NYSBA mailed an additional 2,500 surveys to law firms who had not responded to the initial mailing.

Figure 2 displays a break out of the completed surveys by region and law firm size.

A total of 884 law firms completed the survey, of which 497 (56%) were solo practitioners, 310 (35%) were members of 2-9 attorney firms, and 77 (9%) were members of 10+ attorney firms. As the share of 2-9 and 10+ attorney firms exceeds the universe values presented in Figure 1, responses of these firms were weighted down in aggregate tables to reflect their "true" proportion in the population of New York law firms.

At least 47 law firms in each of the eight regions completed the survey. As expected, firms in New York City completed the largest number of surveys (209 or almost 24%). As the share of surveys completed across regions does not match the proportion of actu-

al law firms in each of these regions, responses displayed in aggregate tables were weighted to reflect the true proportion of law firms in each of these eight regions.

D. Data Analysis

The first series of tables and charts provided in this report includes data presented:

- ◆ In aggregate for all 884 law firms completing the survey. (Data were weighted to account for variations across region and size of firm.)
- ◆ For all 884 law firms responding broken out by size of firm (i.e., solo, N=497; 2 9 attorneys, N=310; and 10+ attorneys, N=77). (Data were weighted to account for variations in survey responses across regions.)
- ◆ For all 884 law firms responding broken out by region (Buffalo, N=70; Rochester, N=56; Syracuse, N=52; Albany County, N=47; Westchester County, N=87; New York City, N=209; Long Island, N=170; and Other, N=184)². (Data were weighted to account for variations in survey responses across size of firm.)

Following the aggregate analysis, regional tables are presented for the eight geographic regions included in the study. Within each region, data are crosstabulated by size of firm.

E. Definitions of Statistical Terms

i. Averages or Measures of Central Tendency

Two common types of averages or measures of central tendency that are used to summarize data are presented in this report: means and medians. The mean or arithmetic average of a sample is calculated by adding each individual sample value and dividing the sum by the number of respondents. While the mean is simple to compute, it may be misleading because outliers (extremely large or small values) can have a large influence on the value of the mean. This is commonly seen when calculating means for skewed distributions like income or billing rates where small numbers of large values often have a dramatic impact upon the mean.

For example, suppose we have the following attorney incomes: \$60,000, \$70,000, \$80,000, \$90,000, and \$100,000. The mean income is \$400,000/5 = \$80,000 which lies in the middle of the sample of incomes. Alternatively, suppose the final income in our sample was \$700,000 rather than \$100,000. Now the mean would be \$1,000,000/5 = \$200,000. Thus, one very large income greatly influences the value of the mean.

Alternatively, the median is frequently used as an average or measure of central tendency because it is much less sensitive to the impact of outliers or unusual values. The median is the middle value (i.e., the value in the distribution with an equal number of values above and below the value). Using our original sample of attorney incomes (e.g., \$60,000, \$70,000, \$80,000, \$90,000, and \$100,000), the median is \$80,000. If we replaced the \$100,000 income with an income of \$700,000, the median would not change; it would remain the same because \$80,000 would be the middle value in the distribution of

incomes. The median is usually reported for incomes because it is less sensitive to the influence of extreme values. The dian is reported in addition to the mear many figures throughout this report where the impact of outliers might skew the near. The median appears bolded to indicate that it is a superior measure of central tendency in that table.

ii. Measures of Variability

The mean and median are used as averages or measures of central tendency in this report. Three other measures appear in tables with the mean and median to convey a sense of the dispersion or variability of findings: the 25th percentile, 75th percentile and the 95th percentile.

25th percentile: One-fourth of the values lie below the 25th percentile, while three-fourths lie above the 25th percentile.

75th percentile: Three-fourths of the values lie below the 75th percentile, while one-fourth lie above the 75th percentile.

95th percentile: Ninety-five percent of the values lie below the 95th percentile, while only five percent lie above the 95th percentile.

F. Notes on The Interpretation of Findings

The two measures of central tendency (median and mean) and the three measures of variability (25th, 75th, and 95th percentile) are indispensable when interpreting data with substantial variability such as personal income. Where substantial variability exists in the economic survey data (e.g., attorney incomes, billing rates, hours attorneys work), we have provided a detailed analysis that utilizes all five of the above statistics. Readers should interpret figures with particular caution when the following patterns are observed:

- ♦ The mean and median are substantially different. The mean is strongly influenced by large values and may be considerably influenced by a few outliers (e.g., incomes greater than \$1,000,000) that are not representative of other data points.
- ♦ There is substantial difference between the 25th and 75th percentile. One-half of all cases lie between the 25th and 75th percentile. When these two values differ greatly, there is often wide variability in the distribution of data.

We have attempted to minimize sampling error by making every effort to see that a representative sample of law firms was chosen to complete and actually respond to the Economics of Law Practice Survey in New York. While extensive efforts were made to ensure an adequate representation of firm sizes at the regional level, we caution the reader that cell sizes are often small and subject to substantial sampling variability.

In addition to variability due to sampling, we must caution the reader that there is also natural variability among responses precisely because there is substantial variability among law firms and the attorneys employed by these firms. For example, the potential universe of law firms (especially 10+ firms) in some regions (See Figure 1) is very limited and there are natural differences between these firms and their attorneys. Therefore, such results should not be dismissed because the apparent sample size is small.



II. AGGREGATE STATE-WIDE STUDY FINDINGS

A. Respondent Firm Characteristics

The survey included the following questions for classification purposes.

- ♦ Judicial district where the office of respondent is located.
- ♦ Number of lawyers in the firm or organization at the respondent's location.
- ♦ Number of male and female attorneys.
- ♦ Ethnic background of lawyers at respondent's location.

Figure 3 shows the size and location of responding firms. Figures 4-5 summarize the gender and ethnic background of responding firms by size of law firm and region.

B. Primary Areas of Concentration

Three questions were used to determine the fields of law most important to law firms. These include:

- ♦ The three fields of law providing the firm with the most income in 2002 or the most recent fiscal year.
- ♦ The three fields of law which the firm's attorneys devoted the most time to in 2002 or the most recent fiscal year.
- ♦ The percentage of total billable hours devoted to each of these areas.

Figures 6 – 8a summarize law firm's primary areas of concentration for the State of New York in aggregate and broken out by size of firm and region.

C. Billing Rates

The survey included questions about billing rates for attorneys and paralegals. Specifically, law firms were asked to provide:

- Equity partners' billing rates.
- ♦ Non-Equity partners' billing rates.
- ♦ Billing rates for non-partner attorneys in their firm by number of years of experience (10+ years, 5 9 years, 1 4 years, and less than one year).
- ◆ Billing rates for paralegals/legal assistants in their firm by number of years of experience (10+ years, 5 9 years, 1 4 years, and less than one year).
- ♦ Time since the firm last changed its billing rate.




Figure 12a Most Recent Change in Billing Rates (By Size of Firm)

Figures 9 – 9e summarize law firm's billing rates for equity and non-equity partners for the State of New York in aggregate and broken out by size of firm and region. Figures 10-10b provide law firm's billing rates for non-partner attorneys for the State of New York in aggregate and broken out by size of firm and region. Figures 11-11b provide the same information for paralegals. Figures 12-13a provide a breakdown of law firm's last change in billing rates for the State of New York in aggregate and by size of firm and region.

Equity and Non-Equity Partners' Billing Rates (Aggregate)



Figure 9b Equity Partners' Billing Rates (By Region)



Non-Equity Partners' Billing Rates (by Region)



Non-Partner Attorneys' Billing Rates by Experience (Aggregate)



Paralegal/Legal Assistant Billing Rates by Experience (Aggregate)



Figure 14 Total Hours Attorneys Work Per Week (Aggregate and by Size of Firm)



(Aggregate, Base = 825)




Figure 15a Mean Hours Attorneys Allocate to Specific Activities Per Week (By Size of Firm)

E. Billable Hours, Expenses, Billing, Payment & Collection Policy

The survey included several questions about firm's billing practices, expenses, and payment/ collection policies. Specifically, firms were asked:

- ✦ How the firm bills clients (i.e., hourly rate, flat rate, contingency rate, or courtappointed rate).
- ♦ The average number of chargeable hours per week.
- ♦ Whether firms have a billable hours policy, the number of billable hours required, and changes in billable hours policy during the last 24 months.
- ♦ Whether firms credit pro bono hours to billable hour requirements and how those hours are credited (hour for hour or percentage basis).
- ★ The frequency that law firms charge for specific expenses incurred (i.e., time spent on phone calls, travel costs, travel time, computerized legal research costs, duplicating & photocopying expenses, postage, paralegal/assistant time, and secretarial time or services).
- ♦ Billing methods used (i.e., retainers, value billing or Per Diem rates).
- Billing options used by the firm including: acceptance of credit cards, use of collection agencies, and offering prepaid legal service plans.

- ♦ Percentage of the n's chargeable hours that were written and the percentage of fees billed by the firm that were uncollected.
- ♦ Expenses incurred by the firm that are included in chargeable attorney hours.

Figures 16 – 17b examine how firms bill clients in the State of New York in aggregate and broken out by size of firm and region. Figure 18 examines billable hour policies used by firms in the State of New York in aggregate and broken out by size of firm. Figure 19 – 19b presents the frequency in which firms charge clients for specific activities in the State of New York in aggregate and broken out by size of firm and region. Figure 20 summarizes billing, payment and collection practices used by New York firms in aggregate and broken out by size of firm. Figures 21 – 21a present an analysis of the expenses included in chargeable attorney hours in the State of New York in aggregate and broken out by size of firm and region.

(Aggregate, Base = 808)




Figure 16a How Law Firms Bill Clients (Share of Hours) (By Size of Firm)




Figure 16b How Firms Bill Clients (Share of Hours) (By Region)

(Aggregate, Base = 808)




Figure 17a Mean Allocation of Chargeable Hours by Attorneys Per Week (By Size of Firm)

Frequency Law Firms Charge Clients For Specific Expenses Incurred (Aggregate, Bases = 776 – 867)




Figure 19a Frequency Law . ms Charge Clients For Specific Expenses Incurred (By Size of Firm)

F. Statting

Survey respondents were asked several questions about firm staffing and changes in staffing. Specifically, these questions included:

- The ratio of secretaries to lawyers employed in the firm.
- ♦ The number of full-time equivalent legal assistants/paralegals employed by the firm.
- Changes in the number of attorneys employed by the firm during 2002 or the last fiscal year.
- Changes in support staff employed by the firm during 2002 or the last fiscal year.
- ♦ The firm's use of part-time or temporary attorneys.
- ♦ The firm's use of part-time or temporary support staff.

Figure 22 shows the level of support staff used by the firm in the State of New York in aggregate and broken out by size of firm. Figure 23 examines changes in attorney and support staffing in the State of New York and by region, while Figure 24 examines use of part-time and temporary attorney and support staff in aggregate and by size of firm.

- ◆ Salaries for secretaries in their firm by number of years of experience (10+ years, 5 9 years, 1 4 years, and less than one year).

(Aggregate and by Size of Firm)



(By Size of Firm and Region)



(Aggregate and by Firm Size)



Non-Partner Attorney Annual Salary By Experience (Aggregate)



Paralegals' Annual Salary By Experience (Aggregate)



Secretaries' Annual Salary By Experience (Aggregate)



H. Perceptions of Local Legal Business Clintte

The survey included three questions about the respondent's perceptions of the local legal business climate for attorneys. Specifically, law firms were asked about:

- ◆ Perceptions of the number of lawyers in the community where their office is located (i.e., too many, about right, too few).
- ◆ Perceptions of the firm's economic circumstances (Compared to 2002, are the overall economic circumstances of the firm in 2003: better, the same, or worse?).
- ◆ Expectations of the firm's economic conditions (Compared to 2003, do you expect the firm's economic circumstances in 2004 to be better, the same, or worse?).

Figure 32 summarizes perceptions of the number of attorneys in aggregate and by size of firm, while Figure 32a examines perceptions of the number of attorneys by region. Figure 33 presents perceptions and expectations of economic conditions in aggregate and by region.

(Aggregate and by Size of Firm)



I. Other Business Related Issues

Survey respondents were asked several questions about other business issues including total square feet of office space occupied by the firm, record keeping, professional liability coverage, and marketing activities employed by the firm. Specifically, these questions included:

- ◆ Total square feet of office space occupied by the firm.
- Record keeping of work performed for clients (i.e., always, most of the time, sometimes, or never).
- ♦ Time tracking increment used.
- ◆ Professional liability coverage (i.e., whether the firm carries professional liability coverage, current level of coverage, the deductible, and the annual premium per attorney for that coverage).
- ♦ The nature of marketing activities used to generate business for the firm.




Figure 39a Marketing Activities to Generate Business (By Size of Firm)

Figures 34-34a provides a breakdown of office space per attorney in aggregate and broken out by size of firm and region. Figures 35-36 examine record keeping and the time tracking increment used by firms in the State of New York in aggregate, by size of firm, and by region. Figures 37-38 provide information about firm's use of professional liability coverage, the level of coverage carried, deductible per claim, and their annual premium per attorney for this coverage in aggregate, by size of firm, and by region. Figures 39-39b examine the marketing activities used by firms to generate business in aggregate, by size of firm, and by region.

- ♦ Rochester Region: Monroe County.
- ♦ Syracuse Region: Onondaga County.
- ♦ Albany Region: Albany County.
- ♦ Westchester Region: Westchester County.
- ♦ New York City Region: New York County, Bronx County, Richmond County, Kings County, and Queens County.
- ♦ Long Island Region: Nassau County and Suffolk County.
- ♦ Other Regions: All remaining counties.

We caution the reader that cell sizes in these regional tables are often small and subject to substantial sampling variability. Such results should not be dismissed however, because the potential universe of law firms (especially 10+ firms) in some regions is very limited and there are natural differences between these firms and their attorneys.



Figure B1 Distribution of Law Firm Sizes (Base =56)


